Introduction to Tracking Seminar

This workshop will cover tracking fundamentals such as scent theory and dog capabilities; articles and their importance; track laying skills and methods; the major components of a track; lead handling and reading the dog. Actual material covered will depend on the skills and needs of the participating dogs and handlers.

There is no minimum age requirement. In fact, tracking is a good for puppies. Working teams must bring a 6' lead with a regular flat collar. A harness is also acceptable. Working teams must also bring the following 2-3 types items to use as scent articles; (1) cloth, (2) leather, and (3) plastic. Scent articles should be small, but not small enough to be accidentally swallowed by your dog. Working teams should bring an ample supply of training treats, and/or some other form of reinforcement for their dogs. Clickers are also permitted.

Presenter: Terry Brown

Terry has been involved with the activity of tracking since 2000 and with urban tracking since 2005. He is currently involved with his own dogs, an Australian Shepherd, Belgian Sheepdog and a Siberian Husky, and has begun involvement in search and rescue work. He has taught classes/workshops on tracking for the past several years in both groups and in private settings working with a wide assortment of breeds and people on all levels of the sport. His motivation methods have yielded positive feedback from those who have been involved with him in this kind of training. Terry and his students have achieved CKC and AKC tracking titles.

From Towanda, PA: Head south on RT 220 to Monroeton (2 mi.) Make rt on 414 West. Follow for 6 miles. Look for white church on left; the next road on the right is Crayton road (runs between horse farm). Make right. We are the third house on the right (counting the horse farm). Before the house is a tan pole barn. Come into that driveway to park.

From Canton or 514: (514 to left on 414) about 3 miles from the intersection of 514. You will pass the parking for the gas company water trucks. The next road on the left is Crayton Road.
